### **WELCOME TO THE 2017 TLC LEARNING CENTER ANNUAL REPORT!**

I am excited to share the news of TLC this past year and how fortunate I feel to be part of an organization that is so loved and supported by our community. Probably the most notable event of 2017 occurred in August, when we opened up our fourth preschool classroom. This new room fills TLC to capacity with eight total classrooms serving children eight weeks to six years old. We have waitlists in every classroom with particularly long waitlists for children with special needs.

Reaching full capacity is a major accomplishment and speaks to our mission, which is to provide, in a fiscally responsible manner, comprehensive early childhood education and therapeutic services to assist each child in reaching his or her highest potential.

The year 2017 was also a milestone year for TLC Learning Center as we recognized over 60% of our staff have been at TLC for at least five years! Some have been here 30+ years! To those who have been here 20+ years, we gifted the TLC "Starfish" award. Maintaining highly-qualified staff for so many years is testament that the folks who work at TLC strongly believe in the mission of ensuring each and every child who comes through the doors reaches his or her highest potential.

Financially, TLC exceeded all goals for 2017. In our programs and services fees, grants and foundations, events, and individual and corporate giving. Because we met these goals, we finished the year with a healthy and positive bottom line for the second year in a row! This is in large part due to our education and therapeutic services efficiency, to exceeding our two special event goals, and to our dedicated supporters who contributed to TLC.

2018 is already shaping up to be an amazing year for TLC and we are excited to share about how we are expanding to reach more children and families. We will continue to seek opportunities to expand to serve more children, to expand programs and services, and to continue to diversify our funding sources. We want to maintain this level of success for the next 60 years and with your support, this is possible.

Our door is always open for a tour of the facilities and we are eager to share the message of TLC to civic groups, youth organizations, and other community partners. ### HISTORY

TLC was founded by local Longmont families as the United Cerebral Palsy Association of Boulder County in 1956. The name later changed to The Tiny Tim Center, and then to TLC in 2013. Pediatric therapy was added to the preschool in 1997. Today, TLC provides early childhood education for children both with and without special needs from eight weeks to six years old, and pediatric physical, occupational, and speech therapies for children from birth to 12.

# EDUCATIONAL SERVICES MANAGER CINDY WICKHAM

### WHERE SERVICE AND QUALITY INTERSECT.

For the third year in a row, TLC's educational services program expanded. We opened a fourth preschool classroom in August 2017, and our enrollment grew to 74 students by the end of 2017. This was the highest enrollment ever at TLC, and enrollment is expected to rise again in 2018.

Special Olympics named TLC as Colorado's "Young Athletes Program of the Year" for 2017, which is truly an honor, considering hundreds of programs participate in Young Athletes throughout the state! Young Athletes has been a valuable part of our inclusive model at TLC for many years.

We implemented universal screenings as a best-practice initiative in 2017 at TLC. Thanks to the assistance of community partners and parents, we completed developmental screenings (vision, hearing, "Ages and Stages", and "Ages & Stages-Social Emotional"). As a result, we were able to identify and refer some children who needed further assessment. Early identification and intervention leads to higher success rates in addressing issues, so we know this initiative is worthwhile.

We are thrilled to see our parent participation grow. Our Pyramid Plus Leadership Team includes enthusiastic parents (and staff), and the team is instrumental in planning our Parent Toolkit Nights. By the end of 2017, approximately 20% of our parents had participated in at least one of these free, engaging parent education evenings. Topics are based on parent interest, and the Parent Toolkit Nights provide parents with strategies from the Pyramid Plus Approach, which is TLC's successful social-emotional curriculum.

Our mission is to help every child reach his or her greatest individual potential. In 2017, over 50% of our students received therapeutic services. Considering TLC's unique population, we are proud to share our student growth data from the Teaching Strategies GOLD assessment tool. Growth data from fall 2016-spring 2017 shows that 81%-90% of TLC students made the expected growth in all areas of development (social-emotional, physical, language, cognitive, literacy, and mathematics). Through the efforts of a dedicated staff, involved parents, and a supportive community, TLC continues to grow and thrive. Thank you so much for your ongoing support!

### **BEST PRACTICES FOR CHILDREN AND FAMILIES.**

2017 was a full year for the Therapeutic Services Department. Our Occupational, Physical, and Speech Therapists were kept busy seeing over 230 families. Some children received one service a week, others might have received several different therapies a week, and others saw one therapist more than once a week.

TLC partnered with a new agency in town. With the opening of the new Longs Peak Hospital, we signed a contract to see babies in their Special Care Nursery. We have been busy working with new babies, their families and staff at Longs Peak Hospital. We are also now in network with Anthem's health plan through UCH.

Medicaid switched to a new billing system which backed up our payments for several months, but we are now caught up.

The Pyramid Plus Approach to positive behavior development continues to be a mainstay at TLC. More staff have gone through the training plus we have an engaged PPA Leadership team. We are doing a four-part Parent Toolkit Night presentation on Challenging Behavior (as requested by parents). We also had a successful Kindergarten Here I Come! night which helps parents of 2018-2019 Kindergartens prepare for registration and enrollment.

Several therapists have attended various workshops, in-services, and conferences on a wide range of topics including Augmentative and Assistive Technology, working with premature and fussy babies, and the impact of maternal drug use on infants. It is important for therapists to stay current and up-to-date on trends within our disciplines.

Therapeutic services collaborates with several different agencies and teams including the Boulder County Breastfeeding Coalition, ABCD of Boulder County, Imagine!, and the Community Child and Infant Collaboration. We are able to bring our voice and expertise to these meetings and participate in work group activities.

Looking forward to 2018!






## 2017 TLC DEMOGRAPHICS\* COMMITTED TO EVERY CHILD






Ages Served




\*Demographics presented from 290 children whose parents volunteered demographic information. TLC served a total of 304 children in 2017.



Family Income Level




### Where They Live





## PARENT PROFILE: JOE BLAND



We were looking for a facility that had really good reviews, a focus on structured curriculum, and that had something unique to offer. What we zoned in on initially was the integrated curriculum that served kids with and without special needs equally. We learned more through a fundraiser at our church. We were talking about organizations that support people, and someone brought up The Tiny Tim Center. I wanted to know more about it, and that capped it off when deciding where we wanted to place our children and where we wanted to give back as volunteers. Our daughter, Violet, started first as a toddler, and then Olen joined the infant room when he was six weeks old. The best part of TLC is watching my kids walk by children with different abilities-kids in walkers, kids who have physical ailments or mental challenges—and they just say "Hi!" There's no difference to them; everyone is just a kid and that's great. That, as a dad,

makes me feel wonderful, that no matter what you're like, my kids



That experience came from them being here at TLC, in an environment where everyone is accepted as normal. Violet tells me that the best part of her days at TLC is getting to draw and color and play with her friends. Every day she tells me what friends she played with and what they did. TLC isn't a daycare. It's a learning center, but it's not just about a curriculum. The kids learn how to work through problems and setbacks. The kids learn to look at life as an opportunity. Violet has a friend who uses crutches.; she talks about her all the time. The friend couldn't run, so they'd figure out how to get where they wanted in a way that included her. That's what I love about this place. It's more than learning their ABC's and their numbers. They'll learn it later. I care if they learn how to deal with people. School is about the total experience of both learning your ABC's and learning to interact with others. At TLC, there's no judgment, no preconceived notion, just "us." And "us" is everybody.



We volunteer at TLC because service oriented and we wanted to show our kids that we give back where we can, so we bring our kids when we volunteer. We've pulled weeds, mowed the yard, helped install things, written thank you notes. We want the kids to know that this is the place we're at and so we're going to care for it. We tell them that it doesn't just help you, it helps other people, too. Because you picked up that piece of trash no one is going to get hurt by it. Plus, it shows them that we're going to be dedicated to what they're in, instead of just dropping them off. It gives me a purpose as well. We trust TLC and are glad to have found it.






### 2017 Revenue %

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
