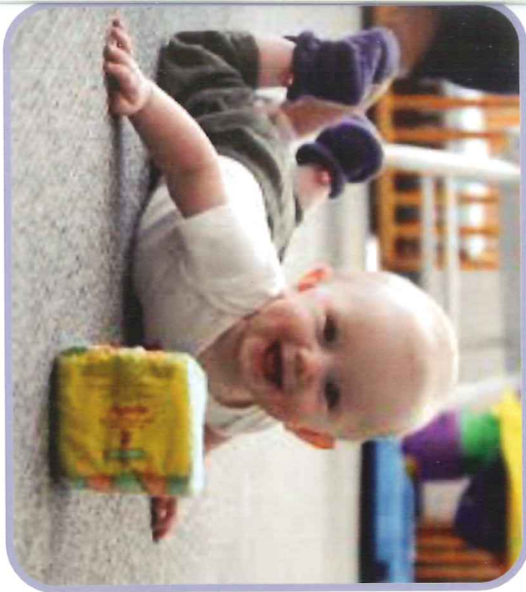


TLLC for Infants & Toddlers

I thought TLC Learning Center, formerly Tiny Tim Learning Center, only served children with special needs?

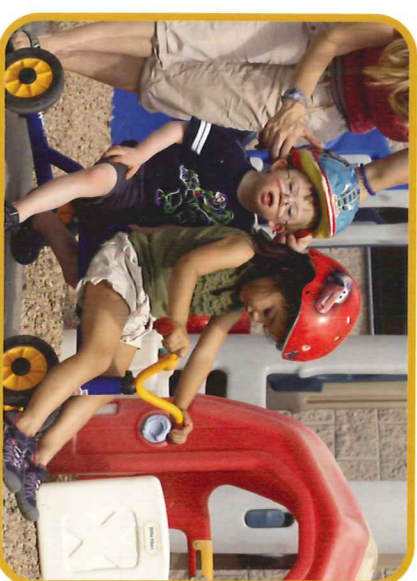
- Children of all abilities are part of our early learning community. Our inclusive program educates children with various learning styles. Strategies are individualized to challenge and best meet the needs of each child.

Occupational Therapy

Pediatric Occupational Therapy focuses on a child's sensory and motor skills, self-regulation, self-care abilities and play skills to help improve functioning in the home and community. The Occupational Therapist assesses each child's needs and abilities. Structured activities and tests may be administered, depending on the child's age and diagnosis.

How can Occupational Therapy help?

- Improve feeding and oral motor skills
- Improve behavioral state, organization and self-regulation
- Promote age-appropriate mobility and motor skills
- Facilitate developmental and play behaviors
- Promote independence in daily living skills
- Provide environmental adaptations and/or equipment to enable increased independence
- Improve eye-hand coordination
- Improve sensory processing
- Improve fine motor skills

Physical Therapy

Pediatric Physical Therapy is a specialty area of Physical Therapy. The therapist assesses areas concerning joint motion, muscle control, strength, coordination, balance, movement patterns, sensory issues, mobility, gait and equipment.

How can Physical Therapy help?

- Develop new gross motor and functional skills
- Improve movement patterns and quality
- Strengthen muscles
- Improve mobility
- Improve coordination
- Enhance a child's movement potential
- Assess equipment and mobility needs

Speech Language Therapy



Pediatric Speech Language Therapy provides assessment and treatment of a child's communication skills. These include speech, language, play and interaction development. The focus of treatment may be on feeding skills, understanding language, building vocabulary, or augmentative communication needs. Parents are provided with strategies to help children to communicate better at home.

How can Speech Language Therapy help?

- Improve speech intelligibility
- Improve sentence formulation and understanding directions
- Improve communication through the provision of augmentative communication devices (low and high tech)
- Facilitate feeding skill development
- Facilitate play skills
- Encourage social communication

Brain Integration Technique Therapy

Brain Integration Technique Therapy is a non-invasive therapeutic technique that combines Applied Physiology and acupuncture to assess and correct learning difficulties. The human brain works using extremely complicated electromagnetic functions, but can cease to function optimally when exposed to trauma and stress. BIT can help re-pattern brain activity through redirected blood and energy flow so that children can use more of their potential.

How does Brain Integration Technique Therapy help?

- Improve memory
- Better reading comprehension
- Improve abilities for spelling and math
- Improve ability to learn handwriting
- Better tolerance for sensory input
- Improve balance and bilateral coordination
- Better focus and ability to pay attention
- Improve motor planning
- Less anxiety and stress
