

#### Hello Bobcats families!

It has been a busy Month already! The children have been enjoying creating art based on Halloween and the change to the fall season. The favorite activities so far were exploring with the pumpkins and leaves on the light table and making potions.

Throughout the month the children have also been working with materials that support one-to-one correlation, counting, and sorting with our farm and leaf counting materials. Finally this month there has been a lot of exploration and support on what helps calm our bodies and emotions. First, we noticed providing opportunities for sensory play, heavy work, work systems (closed ended activities) swinging, and a predictable schedule really support our bodies and regulation. We have also been talking about solutions and options to what to do when big feelings or conflict arise and we have been learning how to ask for timers and for a turn and working on how we wait.

We are quickly approaching the end of October and are excited to see you all for the Halloween snack party and parade on Oct 31! As we move into November we will continue to talk about the change of season, being thankful and grateful, and working on self-dress skills (getting in and out of winter gear). We will also be reaching out to see how you as a family celebrate and enjoy the winter months so we can bring your homes into our classroom.

# Fall into Winter with after school Yoga Kids!

- YogaKids classes combine storytelling, art, games & music to engage the whole child in learning through yoga.
- Focused on building self-regulation skills; energizing & calming through yoga.
- Small (8 students max) group size, open to current TLC students and children in the community.
- Each class is centered around a theme, includes a story, yoga game/activities, handouts, and art project.
- Caregivers should plan on attending with their child if they require additional supports or if they feel it would enrich their child's experience.
- Children cannot exceed 9 hours max/day at TLC.

TIME & DATES: 4:15-5:15pm, Thursdays from November 14<sup>h</sup>-February 6<sup>th</sup>, excluding November 28<sup>th</sup> and January 2nd. TUITION: \$150 for 10 weeks for 1 child, plus \$20 annual registration fee. Scholarships and sibling/refer-a-friend discounts available.

#### Dear TLC Caregivers and Families,

Mark your calendars! Hearing and vision screenings will take place during the first two weeks of November. If you would like your child to opt out of these screenings, please email me directly. All screenings will be conducted by me, Karianne Lesch, TLC's Child Health Liaison. I am a trainer with Boulder County Public Health on auditory and vision screenings, and will be using provided screening tools from the Early Childhood Council of Boulder County. We are excited to be using their newest screening equipment!

As we prepare for these screenings, it's also important to consider the health challenges that come with the changing seasons during this time of year. With fall in full swing and winter on the horizon, colder weather can often lead to an increase in illness. To ensure the health and well-being of our students, TLC consistently follows the "How Sick is Too Sick" guidelines established by CDPHE. We are still strictly implementing a 48-hour exclusion period. Our exclusion policy defines that a student may return to school 48 hours after their last symptom has resolved.

For information on the latest medical updates and current illnesses, please refer to the two prominent red medical boards in our building. The boards are posted in key locations for your convenience. One is located on the right of our curved entry hallway, and the other is directly across from the preschool bathrooms.

#### A few important health reminders:

- TLC adheres to the AAP guidelines for well-child checks and physicals. Please provide a copy of the after-visit summary and updated immunizations after each appointment.
- Check that your child's sunscreen, diaper cream, and lotions are still within their expiration dates.
- If your child will be absent, please call the front desk. It's crucial to inform us about any symptoms if your child is sick.
